The Incredible Story of our Resident: Peter Dorling

Peter Dorling was born on 9th June 1934 in West London. From a young age, Peter's particular love for broadcasting shone through. He became an avid listener to every genre of radio programme, sparking a lifelong passion for the world of communication.

Peter was the eldest child, with his younger sister Judy completing the family. Their mother, Edith, was a teacher, and their father, Arthur, was a businessman. Growing up during wartime meant Peter's childhood was often unsettled. Despite this, he fondly recalls learning to read at the age of four with his mother in the family's sitting room. By his early teens, Peter had already attended nine different schools before settling at a boarding school in 1943. He remembers with a smile that the boarders always seemed to enjoy themselves more than the day students, who had to head home for tea.

English quickly became Peter's favourite subject, and he loved stepping onto the stage in Shakespearean plays such as Romeo and Juliet and The Tempest. Alongside his love of words, music played a huge role in Peter's life. He taught himself to play the piano by ear, something he still finds useful to his day. He also bravely took up the school organ chapel services when no one else could!

A defining chapter of Peter's life was his 40-year career at the BBC. By the age of 20, his fascination with broadcasting was so strong that he attended every event he could find and even visited the BBC daily to ask about work. In 1956, when he secured a role as a junior technician. From there, his career flourished moving into television broadcasting, and eventually becoming an anchor man. Peter cherished every moment, working alongside some some of the great wartime broadcasters and helping to shape an era of trusted journalism.

Life away from the studio brought even more joy when Peter met his beloved wife, Isobel - a bright and kind mathematics teacher. Their love story began on a skiing holiday, and after a few chance encounters, romance blossomed.

Together, they enjoyed ten wonderful ski trips before marrying on 1st April 1967 to a Hampshire village, where Isobel's father was the schoolmaster. They went on to raise two daughters, Tamsin and Karen, and share their Gerrards Cross home with the family dog, Pippa, Reflecting on their marriage, Peter says simply, "Isobel is, and will always be, the love of my life."

Retirement brought fresh adventures. Peter and Isobel enjoyed 50 world cruises as guests of Cunard. Peter gave lectures to audiences of up to 500, sharing his knowledge of the BBC's history and his experiences inside the world of broadcasting. Meanwhile Isobel became the ship's escort, helping passengers during shore excursions and ensuring they were well cared for. Earlier in his career, Peter also spent ten fascinating years in Singapore, presenting news on both radio and television during the country's transition from colonial rule – always striving to uphold the BBC's founding principle of truth-telling, inspired by Lord Reith.

Looking back, Peter considers himself fortunate to have lived such a rewarding and happy life. At The Burlington, his love for music continues to shine as he fills the piano bar with melodies, much o the delight of fellow residents and team members. And of course, his mornings wouldn't be complete without tuning into Radio 4.

INGREDIENTS

- 200g of biscuits
- 75g of butter
- 200g of cream
- 400g cream cheese
- 200g icing sugar
- Cheesecake mixture
- **Strawberries**

METHOD

- 1. Crush up 200g of biscuits until they are fine crumbs.
- 2. Melt 75g of butter and mix into the biscuits.
- 3. Whisk 200g cream together until firm.
- 4. Mix 400g cream cheese and 200g icing sugar together.
- 5. Add the cream cheese mix to the whipped cream.
- 6. Line the baking tray with cupcake cases
- 7. Add the crushed biscuits to the cupcake cases.
- 8. Add the cheesecake mixture on top and smooth out.
- 9. Chop up the strawberries in half add to decorate.
- 10. Place in the fridge to set.
